

CRÉMANT ROSÉ

Michigan

50% Chardonnay, 45% Pinot Blanc,
4% Pinot Noir, 1% Dornfelder

Crémant is a French term used for any sparkling wine not made in the Champagne region. Ours hails from the great vineyards of Northern Michigan.

We whole-cluster press Pinot Blanc and Chardonnay planted and grown specifically for this wine. We take only the cuvée, the purest of the juice with the most delicate texture. This practice minimizes bitterness and accentuates fruit qualities.

Once the cuvée has settled, we put the wine through a second fermentation in a closed and pressurized tank (called cuve close or Charmat method) to build the bubble structure. This is the first year we've added Saperavi, a Georgian red grape grown by Manigold Vineyard on Old Mission Peninsula, which added a beautiful rosy hue and subtle red fruit aromas. The wine is then bottled young and meant to be enjoyed within a few years.
